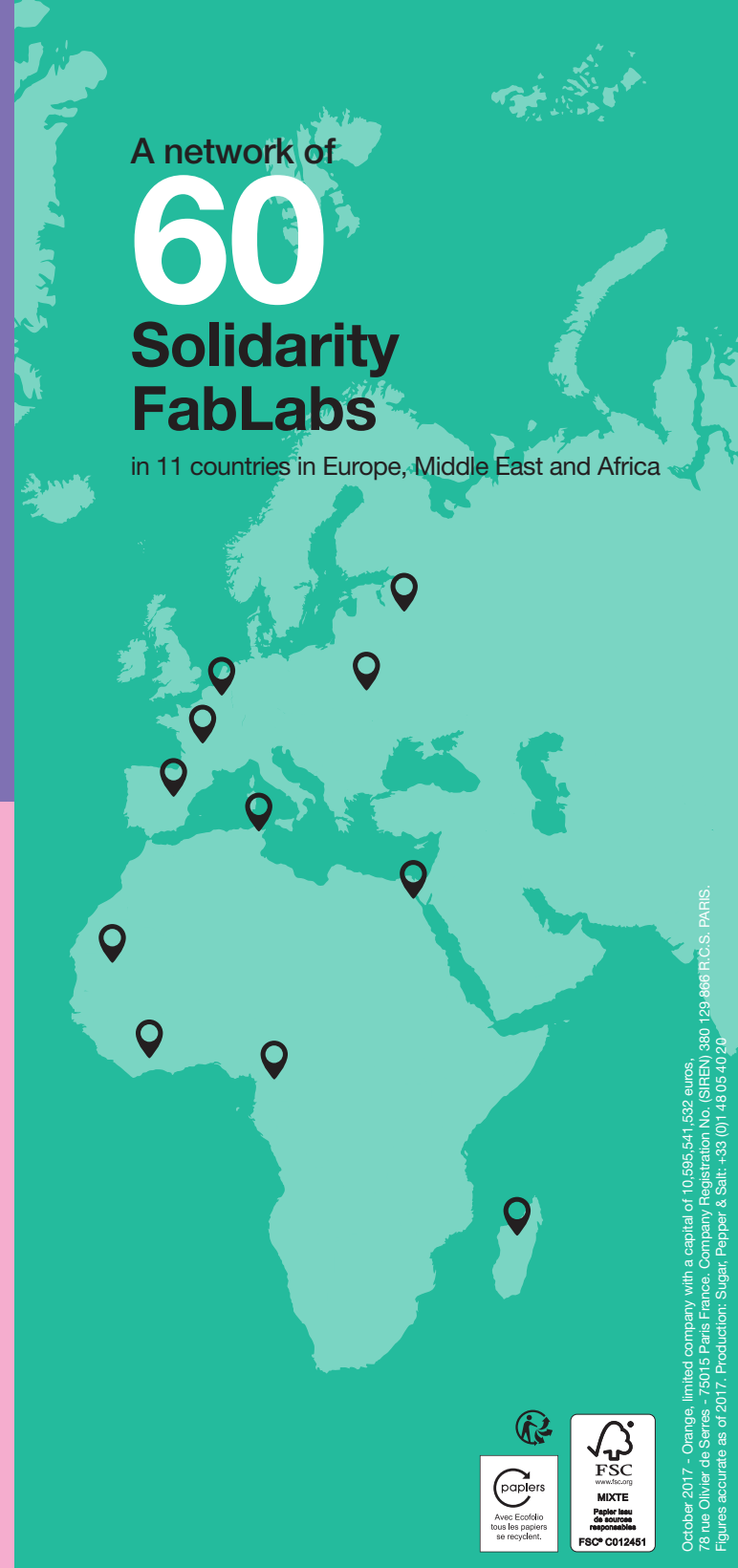

Why?

To give young people the chance to reinvent themselves using new technology, train them to use digital resources to develop their skills, and improve their employability and point them towards a career in digital technology... The Orange Foundation is focusing on digital technology to help young people with educational and employment difficulties, by offering training to reveal their true potential.



How?

With the support of the Orange Foundation, the FabLabs - which run collaborative digital workshops - show their solidarity for youths in need. The Solidarity FabLabs help young people to set up a project by learning to use 3D printers, digital milling machines, and laser cutters among other things. Under the guidance of a Fab Manager, they receive free hands-on collaborative training.



How?

Through their training, youngsters learn how to work with digital tools to find a job : uploading a resume online, using social networks, and managing their e-reputation. Their competencies are acknowledge by a “digital passport” which is a certificate from the Orange Foundation that will expand their CV.

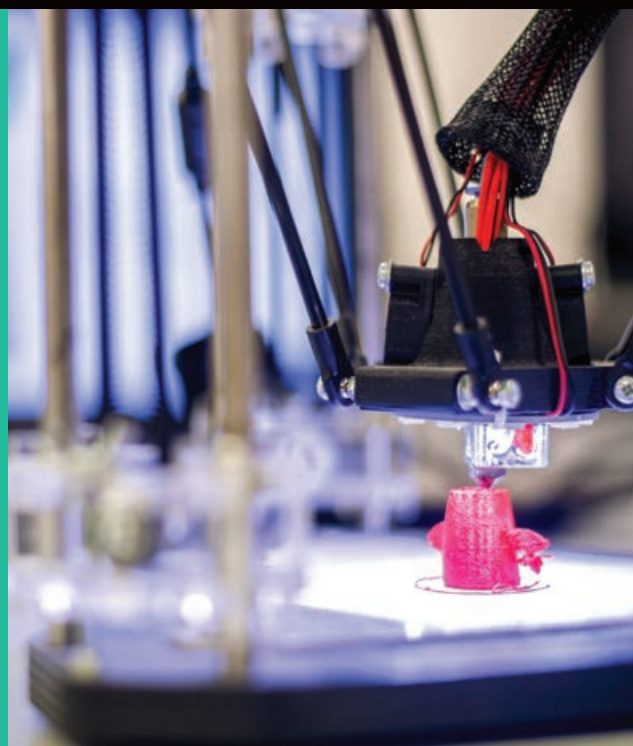
